20. The Department also reserves the right to increase, decrease, alter or modify the item of works as indicated in the NIT without assigning any reason thereof.
21. Use of explosive shall be regulated as under:
(a) Transportation, Handling, storage and use of Explosives (if necessary) shall be in accordance with the provision of the India Explosive Act and General Guidelines, Circulars issued by the department and other competent authorities on the subject from time to time.
(b) The rules and regulations issued by the Sikkim Public Works Department or any other competent authority shall strictly be adhered to with regard to transportation, storage, handling and use of explosives at all times. Proper daily record of receipt and issue of explosives shall be maintained by the contractor.
22. The contractor shall also make arrangement to have photographs of the works taken at least at three stages of the construction period i.e. beginning, middle and completion stages.
23. Damage of properties in and around the work site must be avoided at all cost. The contractor shall be held responsible for any acts of negligence and shall be made to make good the damages.
24. It is accepted to the tenderer to have inspected the site before submitting his/her bid. There may be possible site difficulties for which the tenderer should have their own correct assessment before submitting the bid.
25. The contractor will have to pay all taxes and duties as applicable and notified by the State/Central Government and no claim shall be entertained in this regard whatsoever.

Residential Training for Primary Teachers teaching English concludes

Gangtok, March 01: A five day long Residential Training for 100 Primary Teachers teaching English in different schools of Sikkim concluded at Sikkim Cooperative Union (SICUN), Assam-Lingzey, today. The training was conducted by the British Council in support from the North East Council and in collaboration with Samagra Shiksha Human Resource Development Department, Sikkim.

It may be noted that the HRDD, Government of Sikkim and the British Council India chapter have entered into MoU 2018, in order to support the Human Resource Development Department in different fields of education including training and capacity building of the teachers. Soon after Sikkim entered into MoU with the British Council, the

North-East Council, DoNER took initiative to extend this programme to all the eight States of the North-East.

It is one of the first initiatives under the MoU with the British Council. The programme for the teachers of Government schools of Sikkim, teaching English at primary level started at SICUN on February 25, 2019 with 100 teachers from all the districts of Sikkim. The training was imparted by three Resource Persons from the British Council, Mr. Arun, Ms. Dena and Ms. Iti, who trained the teachers about different skills and teaching styles of the English language.

He also discussed in detail the concept of physico-chemical and microbiological properties of soil and soil health management for organic crop production. He emphasized that crop rotation with leguminous crop is important in organic farming. He distributed various 'Extension

Folders on Organic Production Technologies' and certificates to the trainees.

Senior Scientist (Horticulture), Dr. Ashish Yadav, coordinated training programme. He welcomed all the participants and briefed them about the various talks and activities undertaken during the training programme. He detailed on the Organic fruit production techniques and Organic vegetable production techniques.

Gangtok, March 03: With the introduction of VVPAT by the ECI which is a mandatory record to be used along with the EVM for the upcoming Lok Sabha and State Legislative Assembly Election 2019, the need to create awareness amongst the voters about the VVPAT before Election is essential.

Hence, Office of the District Election Officer, East District is organizing an awareness camp on EVM and VVPAT in various Senior Schools (Secondary, Secondary and Junior High Schools), Bazar, Colleges and Universities of East District as per the District Action Plan prepared for Systematic Voters Education and Electoral Participation (SVEEP). Officials from Election Cell and District Collector staff have been assigned to carry out the programme in coordination with the Nodal Officer of the respective Schools (ELC) and the BLOs of the concerned polling stations. Awareness camp started w.e.f February 25 and so far many schools, namely, Sonamati Memorial Senior Secondary School, Singtam Senior Secondary School, Samdong Senior

The DEO (East) has also set up a permanent EVM and VVPAT awareness booth in the DAC premises to cater the general public visiting the place.

EVM VVPAT Units shifted

Gangtok, February 27: With barely three months left for General Elections as per the direction of Election Commission of India, EVM VVPAT Units have been shifted from East District warehouse located at CEO office, Gangtok to West District, South District and North District EVM VVPAT warehouses, today.

The Strong Room was opened with the permission of ADC East (Hq) Mr. J.C. Namgyal, who is also the Nodal Officer for EVM VVPAT Management for East District. The Nodal Officers for EVM VVPAT Management of the districts, SDM (Mangan) Mr. Samdup Bhutia, SDM (Yangyang) Mr. Tshering Gyatso Bhutia, DFO (West) Mr. Tenzing Norbu Bhutia and officers and IT staff of the Office of the CEO(Sikkim), were also present.

Members from political parties Mr. Raj Kumar (SDF) CEC Member, Mr. Krishna Sharma (SKM) Vice President East District also witnessed the opening of the warehouse and shifting of EVM VVPAT Units.

All the activities of EVMS and VVPATs are now monitored by EVMS (EVM Management System). The New EVM Management System has two components. First is the Web

based application and second is a Mobile application. The Web Based Application has core functionalities related to EVM management process used by users like Manufacture, ECI, CEOs, DEOs and Warehouse in charge, whereas the Mobile Application supports application used by temporary users mainly for scanning at warehouse level during sending and receiving in AC Strong Room after first randomization.

The total number of EVM Units shifted to South District is 112 (BU), 115 (CU) and 161 VVPATs, followed by 41 (BU) 46 (CU) and 54 VVPATs to North District and 82 (BU), 87(CU) and 78 VVPATs to West District, respectively.

All the EVM VVPAT Units are collected by Executive Magistrate from the respective district concerned. A tracking device has been installed in the vehicle carrying EVM Units as per the norms of Election Commission of India to monitor and keep track of EVM Units during the transit which is monitored by DEOs and CEO Office. Strict SOP for security is also being followed. The vehicle will be accompanied by armed guards and executive magistrates throughout the transit.
