Governor inaugurates 70ft Monumental National Flag



Gangtok, October 11: Governor Mr Om Prakash Mathur, inaugurated the 70ft Monumental National Flag at Sikkim Prerna Sthal, Bardang, today. The monumental National Flag has been installed by Indian Army, Tourism Department, Government of Sikkim, and Flag Foundation of India and is dedicated to the nation.

The installation of 70ft Monumental National Flag marked as the 184th Monumental National Flag, prominently positioned within the premises of Sikkim Prerna Sthal, stands as a symbol of unity, pride, and respect for the

nation.

This day also marks the first anniversary of Sikkim Prerna Sthal, an initiative of Raj Bhavan built in honour of the twenty-two martyrs who sacrificed their lives during the GLOF that occurred in the State on October, 2023.

Governor inspects Sevoke-Rangpo Railway Line Project

Gangtok, October 11: Governor Mr Om Prakash Mathur conducted an inspection of the ongoing Sevoke-Rangpo Railway Line Project, Khanikhola, Rangpo under Pakyong District and reviewed the ongoing progress work, which holds strategic importance, today.

Governor was accompanied by Mr Indra Hang Subba MP Lok Sabha, DC Pakyong and officers from Pakyong District Administration.

During the visit, the Governor engaged in discussions with senior railway officials of the Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) to assess the ongoing railway development project in the State.

In a brief meeting, officials from the NFR made a detailed presentation on the current status of the project. The General Manager, NFR (Construction), Mr Arun Chaudhary and Chairman and Managing Director, IRCON International Limited, Mr Hari Mohan Gupta briefed the

Governor on the ongoing development works of the project and highlighted other impediments hampering the progress of the project.

The Governor said that the Sevoke- Rangpo railway project will contribute to the growth of the tourism sector in the State. Additionally, he mentioned that the project will play a vital role in national security, promote industrial growth, generate employment opportunities, and contribute to the overall socioeconomic development of the state and nation as well.

He urged the NFR officials to maintain on the infrastructure quality, safety and timely completion in the construction work.

The Governor noted that this reflects the Prime Minister Mr Narendra Modi's strong commitment to improving

Chief Minister virtually attends launch of PMDDKY and other key projects

Gangtok, October 11: Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang virtually participated in the launch of the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana and the inauguration and foundation stone laying of various significant schemes and projects of the Government of India by Prime Minister Mr Narendra Modi, today.

During the event, Prime Minister formally launched the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana, a flagship scheme aimed at promoting agricultural self-reliance. Alongside this, a six-year Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses was unveiled to strengthen India's pulse production and reduce dependency on imports.

The Prime Minister also inaugurated multiple projects dedicated to the nation, including those under the Agriculture Infrastructure Fund (AIF), Animal Husbandry, and Food Processing Industries, signifying a comprehensive approach towards rural and agricultural development.

Training of 3rd batch of Yuva Aapda Mitra Volunteers

Namchi, October 13: Sikkim State Disaster Management Authority (SSDMA), under Land Revenue and Disaster Management Department in collaboration with National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and Indian Himalayan Centre for Adventure and Eco-Tourism (IHCAE), initiated the training of the 3rd batch of Yuva Aapda Mitra Volunteers at IHCAE, Chemchey, today.

Under the central sector initiative implemented by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), volunteers from Namchi District, comprising of student volunteers from different colleges, are being trained for a total of 5 days. The scheme is designed to train community volunteers in essential disaster response skills, such as relief, rescue, and first aid, enabling them to offer immediate assistance to their communities during emergencies like floods and other disasters, acting as first responders during the crisis.

Mr MT Sherpa, Relief Commissioner-cum-Secretary LRDMD urged the trainees to take hold of the benefits of the knowledge imparted to them during the course of the training and also emphasised the need to prepare themselves in situations of crisis and disaster, if any. He also stated that the volunteers being trained today shall be called for duty in scenarios of disaster and urged them to utilise their knowledge for proper search, rescue and evacuation process as first responders.

He also mentioned that the training being imparted to them holds great prominence as the initiation day falls on International Day of Disaster Risk Reduction, and emphasised the need for them to foster a sense of ethical duty towards the community.

Further, the Secretary also stated that accordingly Aapda Mitra Volunteers shall be recognised for their dedicated service by the state and shall be called to perform parade march on prominent national holidays.

Ms Anupa Tamling DC Namchi, highlighted the of disaster importance management training being provided to them and urged the volunteers to execute knowledge they gain with full dedication and responsibility. She mentioned that the course shall test the mental and physical resilience of the trainees regardless of gender and imparting words of motivation she stated that the training shall mould them towards stronger beings and further help them to execute their work effectively during search, rescue and evacuation missions.

Further, she advised the volunteers to be ready to act in scenarios of disasters, if any as after their completion of the training they shall be inducted to the district state Aapda Mitra volunteers' cadre and shall be utilised as first responders in disaster stricken areas.

Ms Parina Gurung, Additional Secretary SSDMA and Nodal Officer, provided an overview of the Aapda Mitra Scheme. She explained that the initiative aims to equip community volunteers with essential disaster response skills such as rescue, relief, and first aid, so they can offer immediate support during emergencies like floods and other disasters. She noted that the training is facilitated by the State District Disaster Management Authorities, with the objective of building a network of local volunteers who can assist when formal emergency services are delayed or unavailable. She also mentioned that the volunteers shall receive training materials, uniforms, guidebooks, and complete Emergency Response Management (ERM) kits from the concerned department. She also highlighted that the scheme includes insurance coverage for volunteers of ₹3 Lakhs, specifically in cases of death or disability sustained during rescue operations.

Mr Kazi Sherpa Principal IHCAE, highlighted the functioning of IHCAE Chemchey, stating that since the initiation of the institute on December 7, 2009, more than 10,000 local personnel have been trained for air, land and water based adventure activities.

He further mentioned that the purpose and objectives of the training being imparted is to raise volunteers that can help and protect the vulnerable during emergencies and disasters and further helping them improve and grow their mental and physical aptitudes.

The programme also had the presence of Mr Suraj Rai DPO DDMA Namchi, Mr Norden Bhutia Administrator IHCAE, Ms Shanti Rai Senior Instructor IHCAE, and officers and staff of SSDMA, DDMA and IHCAE.

Gyalshing, October 13: Fisheries Department, Gyalshing District conducted a one-day awareness programme for Scheduled Tribe (ST/SC) beneficiaries under the Tribal Sub Plan (TSP), with support from the National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB), Hyderabad at Gerethang Gram Prashasan Kendra(GPK) Hall under Yuksam-Tashiding Constituency, Gyalshing District.

The programme was attended by Ms Sashi Luitel, Panchayat President, Labing Gerethang GPU as the chief guest accompanied by Panchayat Vice-President and Panchayat Members. Also present were Mr Lahang Limboo AD Fisheries Department Gyalshing, and staff comprising of AFGs and field investigators.

The primary objective of the programme was to sensitise tribal(ST/SC) fish farmers about the wide range of Government initiatives and schemes formulated for the holistic development of the fisheries sector in Sikkim, with particular emphasis on the welfare and upliftment of Scheduled Tribe communities.

MsSashi Luitel encouraged participants to take up fish farming wherever feasible. She also emphasised training and value-added producing products. IHCAE Partnership Conclave 2025 concludes

Gangtok, October 10: Two-day IHCAE Partnership Conclave 2025, organised by the Indian Himalayan Centre for Adventure and Ecotourism (IHCAE), Chemchey under the Tourism and Civil Aviation Department, in collaboration with Sikkim INSPIRES, concluded, today.

The conclave brought together key stakeholders from academia, industry, and government to chart a collective roadmap for strengthening Sikkim's adventure and ecotourism ecosystem.

The final day began with a Mountain Biking Expedition from Chemchey to Temi, followed by an exposure tour of Ravangla and Temi Tea Estate, where delegates experienced first-hand Sikkim's natural beauty and cultural richness. The visit highlighted the State's ongoing efforts to promote responsible tourism and community-based livelihoods through sustainable practices.

The closing session was graced by Mr Tenzing Norbu Lamtha as chief guest MLA-cum-Advisor and Mr Lukendra Rasaily Advisor STDC as guest of honour. Also present were Ms Hondala Gyaltsen Secretary Tourism and Civil Aviation Department, Principal Director Additional (Accounts), Secretary, officials, IHCAE faculty and representatives from Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS), Indian Mountaineering Foundation (IMF) and other partner institutions along with local partner organisations TASS, SAATO, ASTHA, and SUTO.

In his address, the chief guest said that it was a privilege to have professionals, scholars, and stakeholders from Nepal, Bhutan, and across India gathered under one roof to deliberate on the future of adventure and ecotourism in Sikkim.

He remarked that the conclave forges stronger partnerships in the field of ecotourism, describing it as a timely initiative to improve, develop and expand Sikkim's adventure tourism sector. He reiterated that ecotourism must be pursued responsibly and inclusively, maintaining a balance between community development and environmental preservation. He expressed confidence that the IHCAE Partnership Conclave 2025 would lay a strong foundation for a sustainable and collaborative future for adventure and ecotourism in Sikkim.

In his address, Advisor, STDC, expressed gratitude to delegates and partners for their active participation. He stated that such platforms play a vital role in shaping the nation's economy and inspire confidence in the future of adventure tourism in Sikkim. He emphasised the need to provide greater national and international exposure to guides trained under the Department to foster integration and professional growth. 

The telephone operator will ask the caller for basic details such as their name, guardian's constituency and GPU, after which the caller's concern will be addressed accordingly. As the platform is currently operating with ten operators in its initial phase, he appealed public to wait patiently for their turn. He added that beneficiaries would receive a callback within 48 hours regarding the progress of their concern and also urged them to keep their necessary documents ready. Thereafter, the operators will coordinate with the designated

Nodal Officers for respective schemes and update accordingly.

Sensitisation programmes related to the schemes will be conducted at the remotest levels. Under the Planning and Development Department, Monitoring Supervisors have been appointed in each GPU, and through the office of the Assistant Director of the Panchayati Raj Department, they will be trained and sensitised.
