Gangtok, January 4: Justice A Muhammed Mustaque was sworn in as the Chief Justice of the High Court of Sikkim at a function in Ashirwad Hall, Lok Bhawan, today.

Governor Mr Om Prakash Mathur administered the oath of office to Justice A Muhammed Mustaque.

Namchi, December 27: Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang attended Pre State- level celebration of Tamu Lochar celebration at Karunthang, Yangang, today.

He was accompanied by Ms Raj Kumari Thapa Deputy Speaker (SLA), Mr Puran Kumar Gurung Minister Agriculture Department also the Patron of the event, Cabinet Ministers, Sangay Yenten Gyatso (Gurung Tulku) along with Ministers, MLAs, Political Secretaries, Advisors, Chairpersons, Zilla Panchayat members, Panchayat representatives, DCs, Sr Police Officials, ADCs, SDMs, BDOs, Heads of Offices (HoOs) from various departments and public.

State-Level Chasok Tongnam 2025 celebrated

Pakyong, December 14: Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang, accompanied by Madam Krishna Rai, attended the State-Level Chasok Tongnam 2025 celebration organised by the Chasok Tongnam Celebration Committee at Saramsaa Garden, Ranipool, today.

The event was attended by the Cabinet Ministers, MLAs, MP Lok Sabha, Advisors, Zilla Adhyakshas and Upadhyakshas, Political Secretary to CM, Chairmen, HoDs, OSD, dignitaries from various line departments, along with members of the celebration committee.

Ritualistic observances, including Mangsewa at the Manghim were performed. The dignitaries also visited the Limbu Traditional House and the traditional Ya Thamma Ten, reflecting the rich cultural heritage of the Limbu community.

The Chief Minister stated that festivals of all communities are being celebrated at state level to recognise and honour the State's diverse cultural traditions. He added that such initiatives also encourage the younger generation to understand, value, and preserve their rich cultural heritage.

He mentioned that Chasok Tongnam is not just a festival but a celebration of gratitude and a way of life. He highlighted the profound contribution of Mahatma Sirijunga Teyongsi, a prominent Limbu scholar and cultural reformer, for reviving and promoting the Sirijunga script, thereby strengthening the linguistic and cultural identity of the community. He appreciated the Limbu community for its sustained efforts in preserving and promoting the Limbu language, literature, and traditions, and for actively using the language in daily life.

He urged all communities to speak and preserve their language, noting that language preservation is central to safeguarding cultural identity.

He also referred to the State Government's efforts towards the inclusion of 12 left-out

communities under tribal status. He termed it a significant achievement that the Limbu language was introduced as a core subject under the CBSE curriculum for Classes in Sikkim schools in 1981. He further mentioned the State Government's initiative mandating government employees to wear traditional attire every Thursday under the 'Traditional Wear Work Day' initiative, aimed at promoting cultural pride, diversity, and the preservation of traditional heritage.

The Chief Minister also highlighted various initiatives of the State Government in the education, health, infrastructure and sustainable development sectors.

MP Lok Sabha Dr Indra Hang Subba commended the State Government for declaring Chasok Tongnam a gazetted holiday on December 15, noting its positive role in fostering community unity.

Furthermore, Mr Bal Muringla, Associate Professor, Sikkim University, provided brief information on the Chasok Tongnam festival, stating that it commemorates the offering of the first harvest to the Limbu ancestral goddess, Yuma Sammang, along with other deities.

He explained that the sacred occasion serves as a prayer for the welfare of humanity, prosperity, abundant harvests, and happiness. He further stated that Chasok Tongnam brings the Limbu community together, strengthening social bonds and serving as an important source of social capital while reinforcing shared cultural values and collective identity.

The programme also featured the distribution of cheques under the Chief Minister's Discretionary Grant (CMDG) and a series of traditional cultural performances, including Sirdhaper Yalak, Hakpary Samlo (folk music), Yalang (Dhan Nach), and Tamokay (cultivation dance).

1. The intending tenderers/contractors should apply in writing for issue of tender documents. The application would invariably be signed by the contractor himself/herself. The tender document shall not be issued to any person other than the INTENDING TENDERER.
2. The applicants should enclose attested copies of the following along with the application:-
 - a) Validated/Updated Contractor Enlistment Certificate. Further, it is mandatory to produce the Original validated/Updated Enlistment Certificate during sale/issue of the Tender Document for verification.

5. The intending bidder shall submit his/her bid in the BOQ provided in printed format. In case the bidder submits the bids in hand written format, the same shall be summarily rejected. The bid offer should also be mentioned in the Form of Bid provided to the bidder.
7. The tenderer shall inspect the site and have their own correct assessment before submitting the bid
8. The Tender Documents, including the Form of Bid with rate offer quoted in the BOQ provided should be placed in a sealed cover with the name of the tenderers and the name of the work superscripted on it. The Tenderer should sign on every page of the tender documents as acceptance of the general direction and conditions of the contract and other laid down norms. Supporting documents listed vide Sl No. 2 should be enclosed with the offer.
9. Sealed tenders may be deposited in the Tender box in the office of the Additional Chief Engineer - II, Roads and Bridges Department, Gangtok, on the date and within the time indicated above.
10. The rate quoted should be both in figures and words and should be inclusive of GST and all other Taxes in vogue.
11. Over writing and correction should be avoided and if made should be authenticated Incomplete/Conditional tenders shall be rejected forthwith.
12. Tenders will be opened by the Tender Opening Committee as prescribed by the Government in the presence of the tenderers on the date and time indicated above.
13. In case of any discrepancy in the specifications printed in the BOQ issued with the tender documents, specifications as per approved Schedule of Rates-2020 will be taken as correct. For items outside the SOR, the decision of the Principal Chief Engineer - cum - Secretary/ Head of the Department will be final.
14. The Department reserves the rights to withhold payments to the contractor unless test certificates are produced by the contractor when called upon to do so.
15. Avoidable damages due to negligence of the contractor shall be at his/her own risk and cost. The Department shall not be liable for payment of such damages (if any), including accidents to labourer at site.
16. The offer shall remain valid for a period of 90 days. The work should commence within 15 days from the date of issue of work order.
17. All the conditions as mentioned in the NIT shall be deemed to be a part of the agreement to be entered with the contractor. Security deposit shall be collected by deductions from the running bills of the contractor @ 5% of the value of work done.
18. The Department reserves the right to accept or reject any or all tenders without assigning any reason thereof.
19. The recoveries i/c deduction of taxes and duties as applicable shall be as per the rates notified by the Government from time to time and as applicable on the date of payment.
20. Subletting of contract work is against the norms and if it comes to the notice, the original contract shall be cancelled and appropriate action shall be initiated as per the rules.
21. In case the man power employed by the contractors are from outside the State or neighboring countries, it shall be the responsibility of the contractors to get them registered with the Labour Department, Government of Sikkim as per the relevant Labour Laws.
22. The contractor shall also make arrangements to have photographs of the works taken up at least of three stages during the construction period. i.e., beginning, middle and completion stage.
23. Quarrying of non-stock materials shall be allowed only from designated/approved quarries.
24. The specifications in execution of the works are to be followed as per the guidelines laid by the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH).
25. Damage to properties in and around the work site must be avoided at all costs. The contractor shall be held responsible for any act of negligence and shall bear the responsibility to repair/restore such damage.
26. Expenditure involved for material testing, cube strength of concrete, crushing strength of road metals etc., at site or in laboratories shall be borne by the contractor. The contractor shall make necessary arrangements accordingly as and when instructed by the concerned authorities.
27. Defect liability period for the pavement work shall be for a period of five (05) years which shall not cover the damages due to natural calamities, formation sinking, landslides etc.
28. In case the tender date is declared as Government Holiday, the process shall continue in the subsequent working days.
