First International Women's India and Nepal Football Match in Sikkim

Gangtok, October 29: Sikkim hosted its first-ever International Women's Football Friendly Match between the Indian Senior Women's Team and Nepal Women's National Team at Paljor Stadium, Gangtok, today. The event organised by Sikkim Football Association (SFA) in collaboration with Government of Sikkim, marked an addition to the Golden Jubilee Celebrations of Sikkim's Statehood.

Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang attended the event as the chief guest, accompanied by Madam Krishna Rai, Deputy Speaker SLA, Cabinet Ministers, MLAs, Advisors, Chairpersons, DGP, Secretaries, OSDs, senior officers and football enthusiasts.

In the early moments of the match, both teams came close to scoring, with Nepal capitalising on a defensive lapse by the Indian goalkeeper. India eventually took the lead through Ms. Somya Guguloth, whose individual brilliance put the hosts ahead. However, Nepal equalised in the closing minutes of the first half with a goal from Ms. Rashmi Kumari Ghising, with the score at 1-1.

The intense encounter ended in a draw at full time and proceeded to penalties, where Nepal triumphed 4-1.

Notably, local talents Ms Abishtha Basnet made her senior India debut, while Ms Muskan Subba started for the home team, receiving enthusiastic cheers from the crowd who celebrated their every move.

At half time, a Thangka was presented by Chief Minister to the Secretary General of South Asian Football Federation (SAFF) Mr Purushottam Kattel in recognition of his contribution to regional football. Citations were also presented to four senior most women members of the Sikkim Football Association for their pioneering roles in promoting women's football in the State namely Mrs Nalini Gupta Pradhan, Former President of the Women's Wing, Mrs Rinzing Ongmu, Mrs Rinchen Barfungpa and Mrs Renuka Chakraborty.

The ceremony also featured the unveiling of the poster for the upcoming Orchid Music Festival by the Chief Minister, adding a cultural flourish to the evening's proceedings.

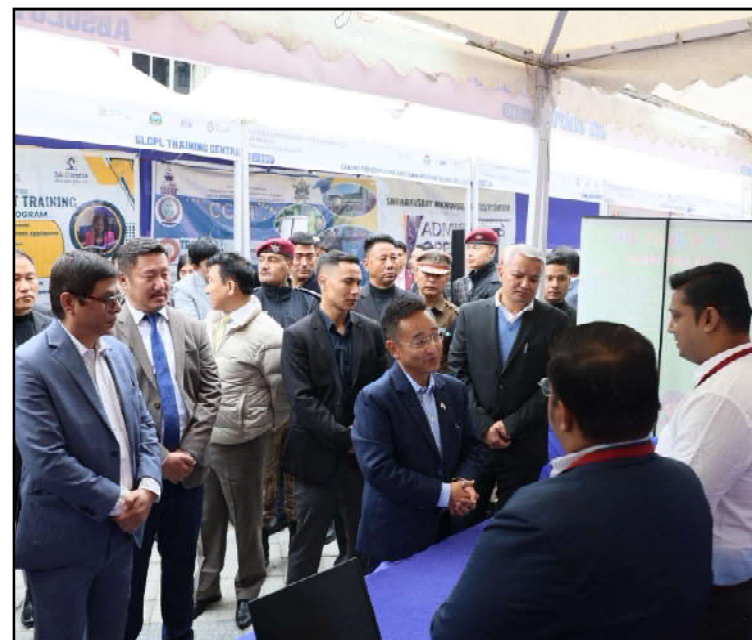
Career Counselling-cum-Job Fair 2025

Chief Justice of Sikkim High Court lays foundation stone for Sub-Divisional Court

Pakyong, November 2: Chief Justice of the High Court of Sikkim, Mr Justice Biswanath Somadder, laid the foundation stone for the Sub-Divisional Court at Rongli, Pakyong District, in the presence of Judge, High Court of Sikkim Mrs Justice Meenakshi Madan Rai, who attended the event as the guest of honour.

The ceremony had the presence of Mr Justice AP Subba, Chairperson, Lokayukta of Sikkim (Former Judge, High Court of Sikkim), Registrar General, High Court of Sikkim, Principal District and Sessions Judge, Gangtok, Legal Remembrancer-cum-Law Secretary, Law Department, DC Pakyong, Civil Judges, Senior Advocates, President and Vice President of the Bar Association of Sikkim (High Court and Subordinate Courts), officials from various line departments and Panchayats.

During the event, Ms Asha Gurung Principal Chief Engineer-cum-Secretary, Buildings and Housing Department presented a brief technical report on the project. The proposed Rongli Court Complex to be constructed over an area of 4.65 acres, will include the main Court building, Judicial Magistrate bungalows, and a Guest House for Judges.



The main court building will include separate entry points for judges, public, vulnerable witnesses and the accused. It will house courtrooms, judges' chambers, a litigants' waiting room, staff rooms, vulnerable witness deposition centre, Judicial service centre, library, creche with nursing

room, record room, Malkhana with digital evidence room, prosecution and office rooms, a conference hall, video conferencing room, server and digitisation rooms. The annexe building will feature an e-sewa kendra, canteen with kitchen and store, drivers' room and a server room.

NAPS Awareness workshop held in Namchi

Namchi, October 28: An awareness workshop on special pilot initiative under National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) Advancing Apprenticeship in the North East Region, was organised by Niyukti Kendra Skill Development Department (SDD), at Government Kamrang College, Namchi, today.

The workshop aims to create awareness on apprenticeship opportunities, streamline the implementation of NAPS and encourage greater participation of youth and employees to fill the gap between job seekers and employers.

The programme had the presence of Mr Satish Chandra Rai MLA Namchi Singhithang Constituency as the chief guest.

In his address, he emphasised the importance of skill-based learning and value of the apprenticeship programme under the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS).

He highlighted that apprenticeship means learning by earning, and encouraged students to balance academic pursuits with practical skill training. He noted that while many youths today obtain degrees from colleges and universities, only a few acquire technical and professional skills needed in the modern workforce. He further stated that the current era demands skilled individuals rather than degree holders.

He encouraged the youth to embrace apprenticeship

opportunities to enhance employability and become self reliant.

Mr D D Sharma Deputy Director, briefed on the objectives and components of the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS). He highlighted that the scheme serves as an important bridge between job seekers and employers by providing hands-on training opportunities in real workplace settings.

He elaborated on the key provisions of the Apprenticeship Act, 2016, which aims to promote apprenticeship training under the original Apprentices Act, 1961. He underlined that the scheme provides financial assistance to establishments engaging apprentices, covering a portion of the stipend and basic training costs.

Ms Sushma Pradhan Joint Secretary-cum-CEO Niyukti Kendra SDD presented a presentation on the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS). The presentation covered key aspects of the Apprenticeship Act, 1961, overall framework of NAPS, and its benefits for both employers and apprentices.

She also elaborated on the apprentices training landscape and explained the apprenticeship lifecycle, detailing each stage from registration to successful completion of training. Highlighting the benefits for employers, she mentioned areas such as social impact, compliance facilitation, organisational stability,

creation of a sustainable workforce pipeline, and ease of doing business incentives.

Additionally, she outlined the guidelines for Implementation of NAPS, emphasising transparency, collaboration, and accountability between industries, institutions and implementing agencies.

She briefed the participants on the crucial role of Niyukti Kendra in facilitating apprenticeship linkages, coordinating between employers and trainees, and ensuring effective monitoring and promotion of NAPS across the state.

Mr Zigmee Sherpa Branch Head Yuwa Sakti Foundation (YSF) demonstrated on the process of completing apprenticeship registration on the National Apprenticeship Training Scheme (NATS) portal. He also listed the documents commonly required on the portal.

Further, he provided an overview of the NATS specifically for engineering graduates and diploma holders, describing eligibility criteria, typical duration and structure of training, and assessment and certification procedures.

The programme concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony.

Also present were DC Namchi, Chairman OBC Board, Assistant Director-II SDD, Principal Government Kamrang College, Principal Government Industrial Training Institutions (ITI) and others.

Mr PK Das Assistant Professor, Sikkim University, also the Resource Person of the day, deliberated on the subsidiary topics of Digital Marketing that included Online Selling, Finding Market Trends and Building Digital Literacy, Branding and Packaging, Open Network for Digital Commerce (ONDC), Government e-Marketplace (GeM), a video presentation on the step-by-step procedure for availing benefits of the scheme, and success stories.

The day also had the presence of the Panchayat representatives, Inspector District Industries Centre Gyalshing, entrepreneurs, and artisans of Gyalshing District.

Pakyong, November 1: Mr Samdup Lepcha Minister for Social Welfare Department, Women, Child, Senior Citizen and Divyangjan Welfare Department attended the valedictory programme of the week-long training-cum-workshop for primary tribal language teachers at the Tribal Research Institute and Training Centre, Assam Lingzey, today.

The training-cum-workshop was organised by the Tribal Research Institute and Training Centre, Social Welfare Department, in collaboration with Education Department with support from Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India.

The valedictory session was also attended by Mr Chewang Norbu Lepcha Chairman Primitive Tribe Welfare Board, Mr Shekhar Sewa Chairman Scheduled Caste Welfare Board and Mr Hukum Chandra Rai Chairman OBC Board as guests of honour alongside Ms Sarika Pradhan Secretary Social Welfare Department.

During the programme, the Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh Pakhwada was inaugurated, commencing its observance from November 1 to 15. The occasion marks the culmination of the Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh and commemorates the 150th birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda on November 15, 2025.

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Meeting of SFPB convenes at IPR Department

Gangtok, October 29: First introductory board meeting of Sikkim Film Promotion Board was held at IPR Department under the chairmanship of Mr Tashi Tshering Bhutia Chairperson, Sikkim Film Promotion Board.

The meeting was attended by Mr Sunil Kumar Mothay Director IPR Department, Mrs Tshering Yangdon Additional Secretary, Culture Department, Mr Bishal Khawas Additional Director, IPR Department, Mr Gaurav Dhungel Joint Director, Finance Department, Ms Karma T Dolma Deputy Director, Culture Department and Ms Vijeta Chettri Assistant Director Tourism Department.

The Chairperson convened the meeting to introduce the

members of the Film Promotion Board and outline the key responsibilities of each department represented in the board.

During the meeting, several avenues for promoting films and developing film production in the state were discussed. Chairperson reiterated the need to promote Sikkim as a preferred film-shooting destination in order to attract filmmakers from across the country and beyond. He highlighted the importance of organising workshops and training sessions to develop skilled professionals such as camera operators, crane operators, spot assistants, background dancers, and others. Press Secretary reviews progress of DST programmes on GLOF mitigation and research projects

Gangtok, November 3: Mr Yougan Tamang Press Secretary to Chief Minister convened a review meeting with the Department of Science and Technology (DST) at Vigyan Bhawan today to assess the progress of key initiatives on Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) mitigation, large cardamom revival and cancer research and prevention in the State.

The meeting was attended by Dr Sandeep Tambe Principal Secretary Department of Science and Technology and Mr DG Shrestha Secretary Department of Science and Technology.

During the meeting, the Department informed that following the 2023 GLOF incident, extensive mitigation works were underway. Sixteen Category-A high-risk glacial lakes in Sikkim, identified under the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) framework, were being prioritised for detailed assessments and the preparation of Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) by the Department.

The Government aims to safeguard Sikkim’s infrastructure and lives from future glacial flood events through early warning systems (EWS) and protection of roads, bridges, dams and habitations. It further seeks to strengthen Sikkim’s position in national efforts on Himalayan GLOF risk mitigation.

The meeting noted that the Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang has been actively leading the State’s initiatives to address key concerns related to environmental and disaster resilience.

Under a Whole-of-Government Approach (WGA), six state departments, two central agencies, defence organisations, academic institutions, district administrations and local communities are working together under a unified framework. A Multi-Disciplinary Task Force (MDTF) and a High-Level Steering Committee (HLSC) were notified in September 2024, while business rules designating DST as the nodal

department for GLOF risk mitigation were issued in February 2025. An Engineering Division has also been established within DST to strengthen technical capacity and facilitate the transfer of research into field-level mitigation measures.

Sikkim’s Four-Step Approach

- 1. Preliminary Assessment
- 2. Comprehensive Field-Based Assessment
- 3. Mitigation Planning and Design
- 4. Execution and Monitoring

Ongoing studies include hydrometeorological assessments, bathymetric investigations, geological and hydrological analyses, UAV-based terrain mapping, and electrical resistivity tomography. Each lake is being studied individually to develop site-specific mitigation plans. Priority lakes include North Lhonak, South Lhonak, Shako Chho and Changsang, among others.

Emerging Outcomes

Technical and administrative capacity within the State has improved, with geographers, glaciologists, engineers and ecologists preparing DPRs internally without external consultants.

Financial assistance has been secured under the National Glacier Risk Mitigation Programme (NGRMP) through NDMA and SSDMA.

Sikkim’s progress in climate resilience and glacial hazard management has gained recognition at the national level.

The meeting also reviewed the ‘Mero Alaichi, Mero Dhan’ mission, which seeks to revive Sikkim’s native large cardamom crop that supports over 20,000 farming families. The Department discussed the decline in yield due to fungal and viral infections, soil degradation and genetic limitations.

Key Interventions include; Protein- and peptide-based antifungal formulations, Lignin-based nano-biopesticides, RNA-

based viral management tools, Microbial probiotics for soil and plant health, Tissue-culture-derived disease-free planting material, Speed-breeding protocols to shorten the crop cycle, Development of reference genome and genomics-assisted breeding for high-vigour varieties.

The proposal, prepared in collaboration with the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) and other national institutions, has been sanctioned. The initiative aims to protect livelihoods, maintain traditional farming systems, and apply science-based solutions for sustaining Himalayan agro-ecosystems.

The Department also presented updates on cancer prevention and research activities being undertaken in collaboration with the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the National Institute of Nutrition (NIN), Hyderabad.

Major Proposals include, 1. Screening and Discovery Research – multi-project studies on genomics, metabolomics and biomarkers under DHR-ICMR and DBT. 2. Prevention and Intervention Research – state-wide programmes on behavioural risk reduction and HPV vaccination. 3. Nutritional Research – study of dietary patterns among the Bhutia community in relation to stomach and oesophageal cancers.

These initiatives indicate a shift from treatment-based approaches to prevention and early diagnosis, offering a model for cancer control in other Himalayan regions.

Also present were Mr DT Bhutia Principal Director DST, Additional Secretary, DST, Ms Baby Mukhiya; Chairman, Sikkim Art, Culture and Heritage Development Board, Mr Sanjay Rai (Dilpali); Scientific Officer, DST, Dr N P Sharma; Assistant Scientific Officer, DST, Dr Laydong Lepcha; and staff members of the Department.

currently underway, will be expanded to all districts if it proves successful.

He also touched upon the growing relevance of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the modern world, stating that rather than fearing that AI might replace human work, individuals must learn to adapt and harness it as a tool to enhance creativity, empathy and human potential. He emphasised that technology should complement human intelligence and values, not replace them, and that the true progress lies in using AI to build a more connected, compassionate, and inclusive society.

He informed that the State Government is formulating an AI policy with a particular focus on empowering youth and entrepreneurs to harness technology for innovation, productivity, and employment generation.

He congratulated two

entrepreneurs from Sikkim, Mr Diwash Kapil Rai and Mr Sulabh Raj Gurung, who have founded the state’s first AI-based technology company, Apuphi Private Limited, which is developing a next-generation career ecosystem. He lauded their entrepreneurial spirit and innovation as a source of inspiration for other young minds in the state.

He further spoke about the Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose University of Excellence being constructed at Chakung in Soreng District, describing it as a forthcoming world-class centre for higher learning, innovation, and intellectual growth.

The institution, he said, will not only provide quality education but also open new employment avenues and stimulate local economic activity.

The Chief Minister stated that the State Government has transformed Sikkim’s educational ecosystem with the vision of

producing not just degree holders but skilled and competent individuals capable of thriving in a competitive world. He shared that the Government aims to establish universities in every constituency, thereby expanding access to higher education across the state.

He also called upon the universities to ensure that they function within their allotted constituencies and maintain academic integrity by conducting only offline examinations.

Additionally, the Chief Minister informed that the State Government is working towards forming a Foreign Employment Recruitment Board, which will facilitate overseas employment opportunities for Sikkimese youth at a nominal cost. The initiative also aims to protect citizens from fraudulent recruitment practices and ensure safe, verified employment placements abroad.

Highlighting the importance of technical training, he mentioned that ITI courses and certifications for trades such as linemen and plumbers are crucial for equipping the youth with employable skills. He reiterated that while the government is committed to creating new avenues and opportunities, it is ultimately up to the youth to seize them with diligence and initiative.

In his address, Minister for Education and Sports and Youth Affairs, Mr Raju Basnet, highlighted the wide-ranging initiatives undertaken by the state government under the dynamic leadership of the Chief Minister in the fields of education and sports, both of which are key pillars of youth empowerment.

He stated that the Government has been taking consistent steps to strengthen the education system at every level, from foundational learning to higher and technical education, while also nurturing sporting talent through dedicated policies, infrastructure, and training opportunities.

The expansion of higher education institutions, he stated, will not only enhance accessibility for students from remote areas but will also create local employment opportunities, stimulate regional

economies, and promote research, innovation, and entrepreneurship. He described universities as engines of holistic growth that generate skilled human resources while strengthening the social and economic fabric of the state.

He reiterated that the State Government’s approach to education and social welfare is rooted in a “womb to tomb” philosophy, a commitment to ensuring support, care, and opportunity for every citizen at every stage of life.

From quality early education to lifelong learning and vocational advancement, every policy and programme, he added, reflects the government’s vision of inclusive and sustained development.

4. Progeny of electors whose names existed in the SIR EROLL of other States

He explained the mapping process for each of these categories and provided practical solutions to issues encountered during field operations. He concluded his presentation by elaborating on the roles of EROs, AEROs, Supervisors and Block Level Agents (BLAs).
