Soreng, August 20: 34th Nepali Bhasa Manyata Diwas, 2025 organised by Sphuran Sahitya Prakashan (Mangalbaria) and Nepali Bhasa Manyata Diwas Samaroh Samiti (Mangalbaria) was celebrated at SL Dow Gyatso Kazi Senior Secondary School, Mangalbaria, today.

Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang attended the event as chief guest and Dr Gokul Sinha, as special guest.

The Chief Minister extended his congratulations to the organising committee for successfully hosting programme. He emphasised that preserving a language is equivalent to preserving humankind itself, underlining the significance of cultural and linguistic heritage. He briefly recalled the historic journey of the recognition of the Nepali language in the 8th Schedule of the Indian Constitution and stressed the need to promote Nepali and other regional languages through modern digital platforms. He further informed that State Government is actively pursuing

the inclusion of Lepcha, Bhutia, and Limboo languages in the 8th Schedule of the Constitution.

Making a significant announcement, the Chief Minister declared that on August 20, 2026, the State Government will felicitate Late Mr Nar Bahadur Bhandari (Former Chief Minister) and Mrs Dil Kumari Bhandari (Former Member of Parliament, Lok Sabha) for their immense contributions to the recognition of the Nepali language.

Addressing the proposals submitted by the organising committee, he assured full support from the State Government. He also announced that the remaining 990 beneficiaries from every constituency will be provided assistance under the Aama Shashaktikaran Yojana on 17th September 2025, to mark the birthday of Prime Minister of India, Mr Narendra Modi, in every constituency of the State.

Sikkim Time Capsule 2025-2075 buried for 50 years into future



Gangtok, August 21: Time Capsule 2025–2075, a 32-kg rose-gold cylinder symbolically designed as a 'Message for the Future' and crafted from 316L surgical-grade stainless steel, was sealed and buried at the Rustomji Deer Park, Tashiling Secretariat premises, today.

Organised by Information and Public Relations Department (IPRD), marking 50 years of Sikkim's Statehood, Chief Minister Mr Prem Singh Tamang performed the final sealing and burial of the

capsule at the designated site in the presence of Mr Mingma N Sherpa Speaker SLA, Cabinet Ministers, MLAs, Advisors, Chairpersons and Deputy Mayor (GMC).

Participating in the ceremony were Mr R Telang Chief

Secretary, Mr Akshay Sachdeva Director General of Police, Principal Secretaries, Secretaries, senior officials and staff from various departments.

The Time Capsule will remain sealed until May 16, 2075, and it will be opened on the historic occasion of the 100th anniversary of Sikkim's Statehood.

Chief Minister described the sealing of the Time Capsule 2025-2075 as a landmark moment in the history of Sikkim and commended the IPRD for conceptualising and bringing the project to life. Stating that the state's cultural heritage, customs, and developmental achievements have meticulously preserved for future generations in the capsule by the Department, he extended appreciation for the contributions from various communities, citizens, educational institutions, and government agencies.

When the capsule is opened in 2075, he said, he hoped the tale

Awareness-cum-sensitisation programme at EMRS Suntaley

Namchi, August 22: District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), Namchi, under the Women Child Senior Citizens and Divyangjan Welfare Department, organised an awareness-cum-sensitisation programme at Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRS) Suntaley, Melli, today.

The programme aimed to educate both teachers and students on child protection laws, including the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015, Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012 and other child related legislation.

The programme had the presence of Ms Anupa Tamling DC Namchi, Ms Kalden Zangmu Bhutia Child Welfare Committee (CWC) Chairperson, SDM Hq Namchi, District Child Protection Officer(DCPO), EMRS Principal, Child Protection Officer, Welfare Officer, Probation Officer, Health Educator, District Health Educator Officer, teaching faculties and students of EMRS Suntaley.

DC Namchi emphasised the importance of understanding Child Protection Acts to address various challenges faced by students. She addressed that the initiative was taken in direct response to a request from student representatives during her recent visit to the school. She also clarified that the Child Protection Acts provide equal safeguards for both male and female students and also encouraged every student to be self-motivated, attentive, and honest, and to feel comfortable sharing their problems.

She further urged the school to nurture each student's potential in co-curricular activities alongside their academic pursuits and to ensure all doubts regarding the Child Protection Act, are clarified. She also advised students to enquire about mistakes and learn from them.

Ms Megha Pradhan (Protection Officer, IC) delivered briefing on key legislation including the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015 and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012. She detailed the procedures under these Acts. Further, she elaborated on the operational roles and significance of the District Child Protection Unit and the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). She provided the toll free Child Helpline number 1098 explaining the complaint resolution process for protection-related issues.

She also focused on the POCSO Act, where she highlighted its social importance and consequences. She

specifically mentioned that prescribes penalties for those who are found false reporting of the case, and also that it is mandatory to report any form of cases related to child abuse like physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse etc.

She also emphasised the crucial role of emotional and psychological well-being in daily life. She strongly cautioned students against alcohol and drug consumption, describing them as harmful substances that impair emotional health and cognitive abilities, leading to addiction, and adversely affect both society and future generations. She concluded with an appeal for students to reject these substances entirely.

Ms Pema Wangmu Bhutia (DCPO) conducted a session on Academic and Administrative matters, while Ms Kalden Zangmu Bhutia (CWC Chairperson) provided an overview of the roles and responsibilities of the Child Welfare Committee, and the Child Need in Care and Protection (CNCP) framework.

Similarly, Mr Manish Rai HE delivered a session on Adolescent Health, Hygiene, and Sex Education for boys, while Ms Roshni Thapa DHEO conducted a session for the girls.

Press Release issued by Science and Technology Department

Mangan, August 20: From August 20- September 10 2025, over 35 experts from six top national institutes (CWC, CWPRS, NIH, GSI, DGRE, NIDM, Sikkim University) and six State Government Departments, Army, ITBP and local community are trekking to the icy heights of Mangan District to assess and

study 6 high-risk glacial lakes.

Using cutting-edge tech-ERT surveys, bathymetry, UAV 3D terrain mapping they will assess the hazard of the lakes, GLOF modelling, design retention structures and plan Early Warning Systems. These studies will form the basis of mitigation proposals to safeguard downstream communities from disasters like the 2023 South Lhonak glacial flood. A team of 5 senior officials from Himachal Pradesh Disaster Management Authority are also joining for an exposure-cum-field training. This is science in action, resilience in motion.

DC Namchi chairs Transgender Protection Cell meeting

Namchi, August 25: Second quarterly meeting of Transgender Protection Cell, was led by Ms Anupa Tamling DC Namchi at DAC Namchi, today.

DC Namchi underlined the crucial role and responsibilities of the Committee members in safeguarding the rights of transgender persons. She emphasised that protecting their identity and confidentiality must remain a top priority for the Committee.

She stated that certificates of identity for transgender persons or individuals who have undergone gender transition shall be issued by the District Administration Centre and highlighted the significance of such certificates, emphasising the necessity of ensuring their equal entitlement to schemes and benefits provided by the welfare department, in accordance with their affirmed gender identity.

Moreover, she directed the Chief Medical Officer's Office to thoroughly verify the legal rights of transgender individuals and ensure proper documentation through the Police Department and she requested that the committee members thoroughly review the procedures and verify the necessary documents required for the issuance of the transgender ID card, in order to prevent any potential violations or misuse of the ID card.

The DC also instructed line departments to carefully monitor the implementation of social welfare schemes for the community and directed the Education Department to ensure that the rights to education and employment, as provided to transgender persons under the law, are duly upheld.

In addition, she also mentioned that Mr Subash Ghimirey ADC (Hq), has been designated as the District Complaint Officer for Namchi District and referred to the role of the Transgender Complaint Officer in the District, who is entrusted with the responsibility of addressing grievances relating to discrimination or harassment faced by transgender persons.

The meeting further briefed on Section 18 of the Transgender Persons (Protection of Rights) Act, 2019, which outlines offences and punishments for violation of the Act. Reference was also made to the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS) Act, 2023, aimed at updating and consolidating laws relating to criminal procedure in India for all.

Present during the meeting were Dr SN Adhikari CMO, Mr Bikash Tewari SDPO, Dr Nation Chamling Deputy Director Agriculture Department, Mr Shyam S Pradhan SWO, Mr Sonam Dadul Bhutia WO, Mr Laxman Tamang CDPO and others.

Awareness programme on Cooperatives organised

Namchi, August 22: An awareness programme on Cooperatives was organised at Sikkim Government College, Namchi, as part of the ongoing commemoration of the International Year of Cooperatives 2025, today.

Themed 'Cooperatives Build a Better World', the event was conducted by the Department of Cooperation to foster awareness and encourage student participation in the cooperative movement.

Mr Pemba Tshering Lepcha, Additional RCS, outlined the objectives and importance of hosting such awareness events for youth, especially students in higher education.

Mr Tsewang Norbu Bhutia, Assistant Registrar, provided insights into various aspects of the cooperative sector, including Cooperative Movement in India and Sikkim, principles and values of Cooperatives, role and importance of Cooperative Societies, its registration process, State and Central Government initiatives, objectives of the International Year Cooperatives 2025 and activities undertaken by the Sikkim in support of Cooperatives.

He stressed on the evolution of the cooperative movement, referencing major milestones such as the NABARD Act (1982), the National Cooperative Policy (2002), and the creation of the Ministry of

Cooperation in July 2021. He highlighted the robust cooperative landscape in Sikkim, comprising over 3,776 cooperative societies across 24 sectors, with a membership exceeding 84,943 individuals. These cooperatives span diverse sectors including agriculture, dairy, tourism, labour and women's welfare.

He also detailed the responsibilities of cooperative members and functioning of the Department of Cooperation, which oversees apex bodies like SIMFED, DACS, SCMU, and SISCO.

Further, he appreciated the initiative of the Chief Minister for conferring meritorious awards on August 15 each year to the best-performing cooperative societies. This, he stated, has significantly enhanced motivation and visibility in the cooperative sector.

Mr Dewan Rai, Vice-Principal of the college and Chief Guest commended the Department for organising the programme. He noted that cooperatives not only bring about social and economic change but also offer promising avenues for entrepreneurship among youth.

Mr Pursotam Pradhan, Additional Registrar Namchi encouraged the students to reach out to the District Cooperative Office for further guidance and assistance.

Gangtok DC advocates adoption of PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana

Gangtok, August 21: Mr Tushar Nikhare DC Gangtok, chaired a meeting with officers from various departments. BDOs representatives of institutions and stakeholders at DAC Gangtok, to discuss the implementation of PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana in the Gangtok District, today.

During the meeting, Mr CP Sharma DE Sikkim Renewable Energy Development Agency (SREDA), briefed participants on the scheme, which seeks to promote rooftop solar adoption and provide free electricity to households. Approved by the Government of India on February 29, 2024, the scheme will be implemented till FY 2026-27. At the national level, the programme is being overseen by National Programme Implementation Agency (NPIA), while in Sikkim, SREDA has been designated as the State Implementation Agency

He also highlighted that under the scheme, households installing rooftop solar systems will be eligible for Central Financial Assistance (CFA) in the form of subsidies, along with the option of availing low-interest loans, wherein the domestically manufactured solar modules and cells will be permitted and all installations must be connected to the grid. Consumers will also have complete autonomy in selecting vendors from the empanelled list provided on the official portal. In Sikkim, subsidies will range from ₹49,500/- for a 1.5 kWp system to ₹85,800 for a 3.0 kWp system, he

To qualify, applicants must be Indian citizens with a valid electricity connection and sufficient rooftop, terrace, or balcony space for installation and the scheme is limited to residential households and excludes commercial, industrial and Government buildings, he said. Additionally, he informed that a Model Solar Village will be identified in each district, with a provision of ₹1 crore per village, based on renewable energy capacity installed during a sixmonth competition period.

He underscored that the initiative is expected to significantly reduce household electricity bills, cut carbon emissions and enhance energy self-sufficiency, while ensuring low maintenance and high efficiency.

DC highlighted that the current uptake of the scheme in the State is low, despite monthly monitoring of targets at the national level. He emphasised that rooftop solar adoption under the scheme is not optional and called upon institutions to lead by example in installing solar systems, while also encouraging their employees to adopt it at the household.

He informed that a dedicated call centre will be set up to support the campaign and follow up with consumers daily. He added that while incremental installations are possible, institutions encouraged to plan for appropriate capacities at the outset to avoid higher costs later. He also underlined that Government offices, including block and district offices, will be installing rooftop solar systems and urged private institutions to extend full cooperation to achieve the State's targets.

He mentioned that PM Surva Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana will not only help reduce electricity bills but also contribute to energy selfsufficiency and environmental sustainability. He requested all institutions to take this initiative seriously, so that Sikkim can successfully meet its targets under the scheme.

Parliament passes National Sports Governance and

Gangtok, August 19: The Indian sporting community has lauded the National Sports Governance Bill 2025 and the National Anti-Doping (Amendment) Bills 2025, which were passed by the Parliament on August 12. Athletes, coaches, sports administrators and more have hailed it as a longoverdue reform to clean up sports administration and protect athlete

With Union Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports Dr Mansukh Mandaviya referring to the National Sports Governance Bill, 2025 as the most comprehensive governance overhaul since independence, the bill serves as a sweeping piece of legislation aimed at reforming how the country's sports bodies are

Among various key features, the Bill aligns key governance provisions with the Olympic and Paralympic Charters, ensuring that Indian sports bodies function in harmony with the best international practices. This compliance not only safeguards India from international sanctions but also strengthens the country's

bid to host the 2036 Olympic

Anti-Doping Amendment Bills 2025

The key pillars of the Sports Governance Bill legislation include age and term limits, which mentions office bearers must be between 25 and 70 years old on the date of nomination. A limited exemption for those aged 70-75 exists only if international sports body rules permit. Presidents, secretaries and treasurers may serve a maximum of three consecutive four-year terms, with a mandatory cooling-off period

Every National Sports Federation's Executive Committee must have at least four women members, two sportspersons of outstanding merit, and two members nominated by the Athlete Commission. Recognised sports bodies will now be classified as public authorities under the RTI Act, ensuring public access to records related to their functions and funding.

A National Sports Election Panel will conduct and monitor all NSF and IOA elections, ensuring uniformity and fairness. In cases of governance breakdown, the

National Sports Board can appoint an ad-hoc administrative body of eminent administrators for up to six

One of the key legislations of the bill is the Safe Sport Policy, which addresses mandatory adoption of athlete protection frameworks, grievance redressal mechanisms and safeguards against harassment covering men, women and minors.

The National Anti-Doping Bill meanwhile gives the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) legal backing as the country's nodal body for anti-doping measures. NADA gets the legal power to collect samples, store them, conduct or delegate testing, and investigate possible doping

Among other features, it also mandates NADA to conduct regular awareness and outreach programmes to inform athletes about banned substances, and safe supplements.

The National Sports Governance Act, 2025 was published in the Gazette of India on August 18.
