

Press Release from Sikkim Livestock Development Board

Kupup, 7th December 2025: The Sikkim Livestock Development Board (SLDB), in collaboration with the Department of Animal Husbandry & Veterinary Services (AH&VS), successfully conducted a Yak Health Camp and Yak Feed Distribution Programme today at Kupup under the 21–Gnathang Machong Constituency. The initiative was organised under the Rashtriya Gokul Mission (RGM) to support yak herders and strengthen indigenous livestock conservation in the high-altitude regions of Sikkim.

The programme was graced by the Hon'ble Minister for AH&VS, Agriculture, Horticulture and Fisheries, Shri Puran Gurung, as the Special Guest. He was accompanied by the Area MLA of 21–Gnathang Machong Constituency, Smt. Pamin Lepcha. Hon'ble Panchayat members were also present during the event.
