

Press release from Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), Border Out Post (BOP) Yambung Gyalshing, October 26: Today, in the afternoon a group comprising 03 foreign tourists (02 females and 01 male) along with 01 guide, 02 cooks, 02 helpers, and 01 yak rider arrived in the Area of Responsibility of Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), Border Out Post (BOP) Yambung, situated at an altitude of 12,246 feet.

During their movement, one of the female tourists, Ms Nicole Horner, complaint of breathing difficulty, presumed to be due to high-altitude conditions. Responding to the situation, ASI/GD Mr Bukul Sonowal, In-Charge, Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), BOP Yambung, immediately informed the Coy and BN Headquarters, following which necessary directions were issued without delay.

Ms Horner was promptly attended to by the personnel of SSB, BOP Yambung. Oxygen and medication were kept on standby; however, administration was not required as she reported feeling better upon reaching the post. She has now fully recovered and is currently staying at Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), BOP Yambung along with one guide and one porter, as a precautionary measure.

Meanwhile, the other members of the team have resumed their onward journey. The swift and compassionate response by the personnel of Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), Border Out Post (BOP) Yambung ensured the safety and well-being of the tourist, reflecting the force's commitment to humanitarian assistance, professionalism, and vigilant service in high-altitude border areas.
